Scott Gunn, executive director of Forward Movement, the project initiator. “As people open their hearts and their minds to scripture, transformation follows. 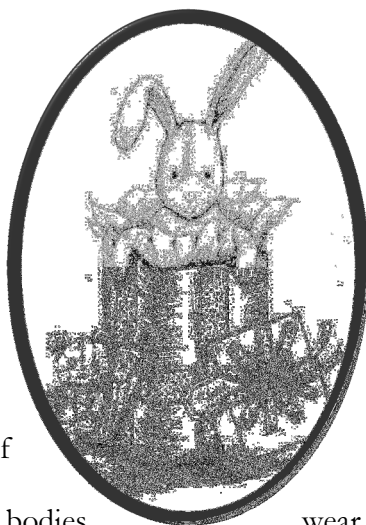


#### Children’s Library Title of the Month: The Velveteen Rabbit by Margery Williams

February is a good time to revisit an old classic and find something new inside to hearten your love of reading.

You might recall The Velveteen Rabbit and the boy’s love for his special toy. You might even shed a tear when you remember the rabbit’s discovery of what it means to be “real.” Yet the story can have a deeper significance when you read it as an analogy of God’s transformative love.

As we age physically, our bodies wear away, just as the rabbit’s fur became shabbier and his tail became unsewn. God’s love for us through all the



years, however, ages us into a more perfect reflection of him. Through the deepening of our faith over time, we become more of what God wants us to be, a special kind of “real.”

Reread this beautiful story with your family and use it as a path to conversation about spiritual growth. How might a dedicated practice of prayer, bible study, and worship change us? What separates us from those who don’t believe or those who’ve never heard of God’s love? How can we share God’s wisdom with others in an authentic, humble way? The Velveteen Rabbit will be on display in the Gathering Space during the month of February and is available in the Children’s Library year-round.

### Faith & Family – Doing More During Lent

I recently attempted to encapsulate the entire Sermon on the Mount in one or two sentences for a Sunday school lesson. Thematically, Jesus seemed to be teaching that God expects us to do more than what is expected. “You have heard that it was said, ... . But I say to you ... .” Following Jesus carries a price, and sometimes that price is busy-ness. We can use Lent as a time to remind ourselves and our families of what God’s expectations are. We are saved by our faith, to be sure, but we honor God by being doers of his word throughout our life and in spite of our cluttered schedules. During Lent this year, instead of giving something up, consider taking on one or more of these additional disciplines.

> Read a book with your spouse or family. They can be longer or shorter, even picture books meant for young children. Some good choices for families with older children might be The Secret Garden, The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe, or A Wrinkle in Time. Adults might enjoy participating in the Good Book Club along with fellow Episcopalians nationwide, [www.goodbookclub.org](http://www.goodbookclub.org). Families with young children will find many books appropriate for the season on the Children’s Library bookshelf near the nursery.

> Exercise and commit to a healthier diet. Practice moderation and strengthen yourself for doing God’s work in the world.

> Keep a journal, draw, or paint as inspired by the Lectionary reading. You can get a list of the readings, as well as links to art and prayers, by visiting <https://lectionary.library.vanderbilt.edu/lections.php?year=B&season=Lent>.

> Share a meal with a friend or neighbor at least once every week. Perhaps the most important of God’s expectations is that we remain in good relationship not



just with him, but also with one another. Healthy relationships require a time commitment. Set aside enough time to eat and listen to someone else, sharing joys and concerns, lifting each other up.

> Attend formation programs and worship every Sunday morning. Resurrection offers programs for all ages at 9:30 am, and there is no downside to joining a program already in progress. Commit to strengthening your religious education and worship life for at least the Sundays in Lent, if not longer.
