### AND THE TRANSITION BEGINS ... NOTES FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN



The time of Nicholas' departure has come all too quickly. The Vestry is taking the first steps in the process of calling a new rector. I have been busy contacting supply clergy to offer the Eucharist during the summer months, and I am happy to report good

progress in this regard. I know that you will be ready with a gracious Resurrection welcome to the visiting clergy, even as we will be feeling the reality of Nicholas' departure in the coming weeks.

The Vestry had a very fruitful meeting with Deacon d'Rue Hazel on Sunday, June 3, outlining the process we will follow for our search. As the first step, I have written to Bishop Waldo on behalf of the Vestry, requesting permission to begin the search process. In the letter, I outlined the plans for lay leadership and partnerships with staff which will enable us to continue our most important ministries during this transition period. I've listed them below.

Pastoral Care: the Shepard team headed by Lou Wynne, the Daughters of the King, and Denise Brown

Mission and Outreach: Jan Puzar, who will be seeking assistance

And what will our life together be like? We will hear a different voice from the pulpit nearly every Sunday. We'll be keeping our momentum going by participating in our ministries and fellowship

gatherings. We'll be thinking about candidates for the search committee: people who participate in the worship and life of the parish and who can make the commitment of time and energy to this important task. It's a time to reflect on who we are as a church and who we are called to be as the Church of the Resurrection, Greenwood.

Among the activities we can begin now, the Vestry will be making plans to offer the US Congregational Life Survey to our parishioners. We last completed this survey in 2012, and Bishop Waldo recommends that each parish complete the survey every three years. This survey identifies parish strengths as reported by the members and compares the strengths of our church to other churches of similar size. Please watch for information on this survey. Greater participation in the survey will provide a better measurement of our strengths and better identification of the areas which may need attention as we move forward.

The Vestry is your leadership team. We have posted our photos on the bulletin board near the nursery. Please share your thoughts with us, and please include us and your church in your prayers.

## **The Parables of Jesus in the Gospel of Luke**

**Sundays, July 15 – August 5  
Emmaus Hall 9:30 AM  
Led by Chuck McDonnell**

Our Lord Jesus taught in parables. This four-week study will examine many [most?] of the parables of Jesus found in the gospel of Luke. We will begin by considering the rhetorical mandates of purpose and audience: to whom was Jesus speaking – the crowds, the Pharisees, his disciples, individuals? How does his audience change in the context of the gospel written 70 years later, and to those who read the parables today? When we consider the purpose, we will consider not only His message to his live audiences, but also in the context of what happens just before and immediately after. Most importantly, we will examine how each parable speaks to our own self. We begin, though, with the Parable of the Two Sons, Mathew 21:28-32.



## **Book Giveaway and Gullah/Geechee Histo-Musical Performance – Sat., July 14**

The youth of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church and Weston Chapel A.M.E. Church invite you to bring your children and grandchildren and those of your friends and neighbors to two book giveaways on Saturday, July 14. Four hundred books were purchased for the Greenwood Diversity Committee with funds made possible by Starz24 Josh Norman. The books are suitable for preschool through middle school ages.



Through a video recording, Josh Norman, philanthropist and Washington Redskins cornerback, will welcome children to the book events. Linda Powell, youth director at Our Lady of Lourdes, and the Rev. Furman Miller of Weston Chapel are coordinating the giveaway with assistance from the youth in their parishes. The goal is to support literacy and cooperative opportunities for youth. A morning session will be held from 10 to 11:30 at Weston Chapel with the afternoon session from 1:30 to 3 at Our Lady of Lourdes.

A highlight at both sessions will be a histo-musical presentation by Queen Quet, Chieftess of the Gullah/Geechee Nation. Founder of the premiere advocacy organization for the continuation of Gullah/Geechee culture, the Gullah/Geechee Sea Island Coalition, she has given histo-musical presentations throughout the world. Her visit is made possible by a grant from Duke Energy.

This event is an expansion of the three-month Let's Talk about Race in America series, coordinated by the Greenwood Diversity Committee. Series sponsors include Duke Energy, Friends of the Greenwood County Library System, the Greenwood County Library System, Lander University, South Carolina Humanities and Starz24 Josh Norman.



Our Camp Kanuga Day Camp offers creative and educational activities that allow campers to engage with their community and make new friends. ## Would you like someone from Resurrection to bring you communion?

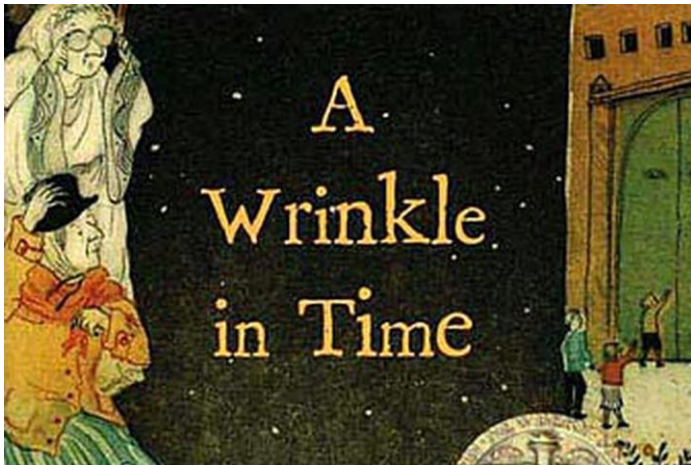

### Children's Library Title of the Month – A Wrinkle in Time by Madeleine L'Engle

“The light spread out and where it touched the Darkness the Darkness disappeared.” Light conquering darkness is just one of many themes in Madeleine L'Engle's A Wrinkle in Time that works easily as a metaphor for Christian faith. This treasured novel offers much in the way of religious allegory and allusions and aptly serves as the foundation of our vacation bible school program this summer.

The story begins with Meg Murry, the oldest of four children, suffering in silence due to the long, unexplained disappearance of her father and a personal struggle to accommodate her awkwardness within a

community of “regular” people. Her youngest brother, Charles Wallace, is also something of a misfit, unwilling to speak to anyone outside his immediate family. Yet when he does speak, he shows an intellect beyond the capacity of a typical five-year-old boy. Together with a recently befriended school mate, Calvin O'Keefe, Meg and Charles Wallace are “tessered” to new worlds by three mysterious women. They must find their father in the far reaches of not just space, but also time, before he is completely overcome by the brainwashing darkness of IT. Along the way, Meg learns tough lessons about her own character, the suffocating danger of blind conformity, and the power of love. A Wrinkle in Time is a treasure for young people worldwide and should be read and re-read by all ages.
