I Opening Prayer & Bible Study

Ephesians 2: 11-20

II Consent agenda: Minutes & Financial Report

- The minutes of the previous meeting were passed unanimously with the following amendments: the Mardi Gras fundraiser was held in February rather than January (Item VI), and the dates for VBS/Clef Notes and for Kanuga Day Camp should have read 6th 9th August and 23rd 27th July respectively (Item IX).
- The Financial Report was passed by consent.

III Security Meeting (Jan Puzar)

- A security meeting for churches hosted by SLED had been very informative. As a result of said meeting, suggest/recommend
 - Safety teams to monitor entrances
 - Lock some doors after service commences
 - Ensure Nursery staff and others of procedures that are implemented
 - Note the Bishop's guidance on the carrying of concealed weapons
- We would need to be willing and able to implement those procedures we put in place; drills would be important for the efficacy of any measures. Cecily Hughes gave voice to how vulnerable one could feel alone in Emmaus Hall.
- Joe Fennell will call on a team of people to come up with suggestions, reporting back to the Vestry in 30-60 days.
- The Vestry voted unanimously to set up a Security Committee.

IV Invite-Welcome-Connect Meeting

- Cecily Hughes & John Cobb had attending a very informative meeting about this at Trinity Cathedral. We need to invite people more successfully – research shows up to 86% of people were more likely to come to church if they were invited.
- Welcoming Presently, coffee & lemonade after the service is more successful as social time for those who already know each other. We need to have greeters, ushers and the Vestry members of the month to work together as a team; greeters could have an enhanced role at a welcome table in Emmaus Hall.
- First need is train those who are already in the role of greeters and ushers. Nicholas would set up a meeting sometime in May.
- It was agreed that the use of name tags would be effective; perhaps 'business' cards could be given out by those involved in welcoming newcomers.

V Organ Installation Update

As of today, the old organ (apart from the console) is gone, and we are expecting the new digital organ to be in place very soon. We need a physical network cable to be set up, plus shelves at the back of the church for the speakers, which will be of the wired type. A question was raised about the internet security of the organ.

VI Holy Week & Easter

There was an excellent response to all services during the period of Maundy Thursday to Easter Sunday.

VII Senior Warden Report (Jan Puzar)

- Chris Jayne is leaving the Tutoring Committee at the end of May, with Chuck McDonnell taking over her role for a set time period. It had been suggested honouring Chris at Pentecost for her work, but since she has had a fall and broken some bones on her European vacation, this might have to be put on hold.
