We gather in Emmaus Hall at 9:30 each Sunday!


## Don't forget to turn back the clock!

**Visual Theology?**

If you've been attending Sunday LiFT, you've been introduced to the artistic and preaching gifts of Steve Thomason, a Lutheran pastor and graphic artist. We've shown some of his "Thketches" on our bible readings. In addition to pastoring his


When we enter the season of Advent on Sunday,


