This year Lent is basically the month of March. One month we can all do something for one month, right? I was thinking about that when praying about our Lenten formational program. Wednesday



All 6th through 12th graders are encouraged to




participate in our EYC programs! We had a great time with Mary Balfour at our Tacky Sweater party and at our January Bowling Night. The fun continues...


Save the Date: Sunday, March 22 at 3:30 Organ Recital by Doug Marshall

Children's Library Feature:

Belle, the Last Mule at Gee's Bend by Calvin Alexander Ramsey & Bettye Stroud



February is Black History Month and a great time to highlight a unique contribution to our children's library collection. In July 2018, as an extension of

the Let's Talk About Race Series in Greenwood, Josh Norman's Starz24 Foundation gave a \$2000 grant to support children's literacy and cooperation in our community. That grant made it possible for two area churches, Our Lady of Lourdes and Weston A.M.E. Chapel, to host book giveaways. My family attended one of them, and I brought back a handful of books for our children's library. One of them is Belle, the Last Mule at Gee's Bend. This storybook is not just a story, but a tribute to the heroism of a people. The community of Boykin, Alabama, also known as Gee's Bend, is almost inaccessible due to a bend in the Alabama river. The people were dependent upon a ferry service to reach the county seat in Camden. Inspired by a sermon from Dr. Martin Luther King given in Gee's Bend, several Gee's Bend residents, known as "Benders" attempted to use the ferry to Camden to register to vote. The local government shut down the ferry service to prevent them. They registered anyway, by traveling over an hour out of their way. They didn't have many vehicles to make that trip, but they had mules, including Belle. Belle and the Benders made national news for their courage and perseverance, and Belle went on to play an important role in history as told through this book. Take it home to read this month. Belle, the Last Mule at Gee's Bend will be on display near the Children's Bookshelf throughout February. ~ Elizabeth Floyd
