

Faith Formation for Lent

We will shift to a new formation program to mark
the season of Lent. Beginning on Sunday, March 1,
Mary Balfour will begin leading a discussion forum
about the life and work of Fred Rogers. Likely all
of you know him as Mr. Rogers of Mr. Roger's
Neighborhood, a long-running children's public
television show. Yet, Fred Rogers had a long
career in ministry both on and off screen. He was
educated in both musical production and theology,
first working in the media and then ordained in the
Presbyterian church. His sincere desire was to
make television a vehicle for encouraging
children's healthy growth, physically and
emotionally. What he accomplished, however, was
an educational vehicle for all ages in compassion
and love.

Adults and older teens are encouraged to attend
our Mr. Rogers' program beginning Sunday
morning, March 1, at 9:30 AM in Emmaus Hall. The
program will continue on Wednesday evenings and
Sunday mornings throughout the season of Lent:

Have you ever wondered what goes into the making of a single cell phone? What materials make

up a cell phone? How many people and cultures and countries are part of its manufacture? What happens to a cell phone when time comes for the next upgrade to a newer, better model? The Story of Stuff Project attempts to answer each of those questions by exploring the materials economy: extraction, production, distribution, consumption and disposal of all our stuff. Through answering those questions, the project teaches the impact that our culture's obsession with stuff has on the health of our planet and its people. Although the project is designed to enlighten adults on the consequences of consumerism, PBS created a younger version for children called Loop Scoops.

During the season of Lent, children and younger teens are invited to attend a formation program that connects the Story of Stuff to our role as co-creators of God's kingdom on earth. We will watch a Loop Scoop pertaining to an item children frequently use (e.g., the ubiquitous juice box) then consider how its use and disposal impacts the environment. We'll brainstorm for alternatives and create an informational poster display to share our learning with the congregation.

All children and tweens (through 8th grade) are invited to join us in the Sunday School rooms in the old parish hall each Sunday morning of Lent, beginning March 1 at 9:30 AM.

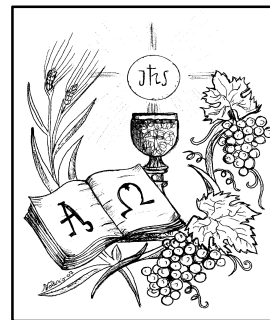
Organ Recital by Doug Marshall Sunday, March 22 at 3:30

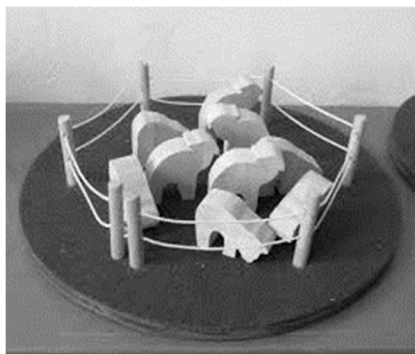


Community Outreach Bulletin Board

Children's Worship Needs You!

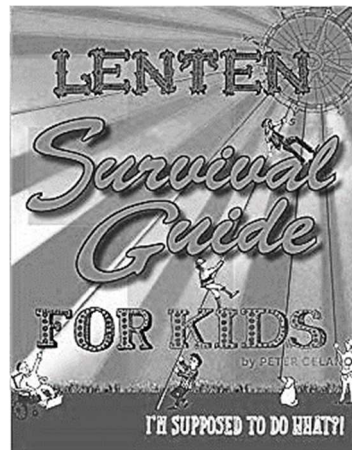
Our parish endeavors to pass on our faith tradition and encourage the spiritual growth of even the youngest members of the



congregation. One pathway for that formation is our program of Young Children & Worship. It is a Montessori-style of formation that uses felt and wooden manipulatives to tell the biblical narrative

with an emphasis on wondering and reflection. Two volunteers lead the program each Sunday during the 10:30 worship service. One is a storyteller; the other is a greeter who guides the children to and from the Nave for participation in worship. Our Children's Worship program is in need of new volunteers, particularly those willing to be greeters. The commitment is minimal as volunteers serve only once a month. 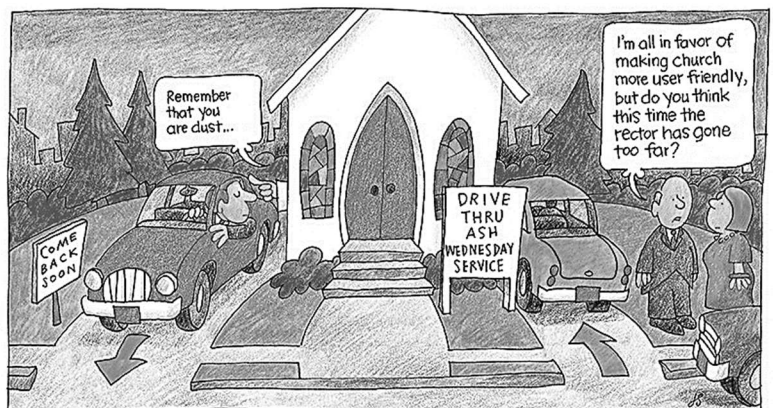
Children's Library Feature:
