



Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!





Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!



Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!



Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!



Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!







Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.



Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!



Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!

Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!



Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!



Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!







Sacred Ground - Beginning September 13



Beginning on Monday, September 13, we will begin a new monthly

program called Sacred Ground. It is provided by the national Episcopal Church, and several local congregations in South Carolina have used it and loved it. A great description can be found on the national church's website:

The 10-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories... Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

We'll meet on the second Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 in Emmaus Hall.

Intentional Small Groups for All Ages – Beginning the week of September 13

Like most churches, Resurrection has long offered Christian education programs on Sunday mornings between the two worship services, commonly known



as Sunday School. Attendance at Sunday School has fallen remarkably over the past years, which suggests that our tradition may need to change. So we are trying something entirely new!

Beginning the week of September 13, we will offer traditional Christian education through intentional small group gatherings. Each group will use the same curriculum, but each will meet at the time, date and location of the group's choice. Mary Balfour and Elizabeth have collaborated to establish small group cohorts

connected loosely by a shared characteristic. For example, "The Lakers" are those who live on Lake Greenwood, and "The Early Birds" are those who regularly attend the early worship service. Our cohorts won't be perfectly matched, and we invite groups to swap members, to combine or even to split if necessary. The important point is to make your group a priority; make the time to be a part of it.

We'll have an intentional small group for children, one for teenagers, and one or more for parents; these three cohorts will meet at the same time at church, most likely on Sunday evenings. Nursery care for little ones will be provided during these gatherings if requested.

Each group will have a leader who agrees to serve as the tie that binds the group together through communication and enthusiasm. We will ask the leader to make the first contact with each member of the group and to coordinate the meetings. Each member of our church will receive a phone call during the month of August from a small group leader. Answer that call! Be a part of this!

Our formation curriculum, adapted for all ages, is called "Exploring the Bible." It is a simple form of bible study using a book called *The Path*. But the small groups gatherings are not meant to be just bible study. We are a church family; spending time together should always involve fun and laughter. We mean these groups to serve as an opportunity to trade stories of joy, humor and sometimes, disappointments. We mean them to provide a community, a circle of friends, if you will, for everyone in our church.

Search for a New Bishop



For almost twelve years, the Right Rev. Andrew Waldo has served as the Eighth Bishop of the

Diocese of Upper South Carolina. The last day of 2021 will mark his last day in that role. Right now, a Nominating Committee is forming a slate of candidates for the role of Ninth Bishop. They were appointed last September by the Diocesan Standing Committee and created a diocesan profile with input from a diocesan-wide survey. Then they received nominations and began the work of discerning those who best fit our profile. Through prayer, meetings, interviews and research, the Committee created a short-list of candidates. Those candidates recently met with the Committee at Camp Gravatt. The Committee also opened the process to nominees by petition. They are now preparing a slate of candidates to present to the Standing Committee on August 14. The Diocese will inform us all of the slate in late August or early September. Then on September 11 and 12, the Delegates to the Diocesan Convention (from Resurrection: Lisa Anderson, Summer Booker, Mary Balfour, Cecily Hughes, Jane Merrill and Dawn Puderbaugh) will meet the slated candidates for "walk-abouts" at Heathwood Hall and Christ Church Episcopal School. Finally, on September 25, the Delegates will vote for the election of the Ninth Bishop!

You might be surprised to learn that Resurrection was the parish of four previous bishops! That is, four of our former rectors went on to become a bishop: Theodore D. Bratton, founder and priest in charge of our parish from 1892 to 1898 later became the Bishop of Mississippi in 1903; Albert Stuart was our Rector from 1931 to 1935 and later become the Bishop of Georgia in 1954; William A. Beckham served Resurrection from 1958 to 1963 and then was elected the Sixth Bishop of Upper South Carolina in 1979; Charles Von Rosenberg was Rector of Resurrection from 1983 to 1989 and then became the Bishop of East Tennessee in 1999. We must provide fertile ground for God's recruitment!

If you aren't already familiar with our church's governance, here is a very brief overview: The Episcopal Church with a capital "E" is an episcopal church, which means it is overseen by bishops (the word "episcopal" comes from the Greek episkopos, "overseer"). Other Christian denominations are in this sense, episcopalian,

such as Catholics, Lutherans and Methodists. A bishop is the chief pastor of a diocese and presides at services of confirmation, reception and reaffirmation and frequently visits parishes to assist in carrying out the ministry of the church. During his tenure, Bishop Waldo has been involved with the South Carolina Bishops' Public Education Initiative (AME, Episcopal, Lutheran, Roman Catholic, United Methodist), which works toward education equity in public schools. He has also supported our diocese's work in Cange, Haiti and its surrounding villages. Most recently, Bishop Waldo has led our diocese's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage your prayers for the Nominating Committee, the Standing Committee and all the candidates for the office of Bishop. They are performing a great service to us, and it is very important work indeed!


