Columbarium News

The Church of the Resurrection's columbarium was established in 2003 as a sacred final resting place within our courtyard for the cremated remains of the saints who choose to reside there. If you've visited the columbarium, you've noticed that niches contain both the remains of individuals and those of couples. The columbarium has become a welcome option for many as they begin the process of estate planning. So much so, in fact, that there are currently only ten spaces remaining in the original structure. The cost for an individual placement is \$1025.00 and for a couple, \$1320.00. The vestry is considering a plan to enlarge the columbarium with the understanding that the cost of the niches in the addition will be higher.

Mission Partnership News

Through the coordination of its Mission Partnerships Committee, our church donated \$22,137 to local charities in January 2022! These funds came from the Mardi Gras Celebration in 2021, the Race to be Thankful in November, and the 2022 Mission Partnership allocation from the Parish. We have an incredibly generous community, and we heartily thank all who gave. And that's not the only good news to share:

-- Allison Wooten is joining the Mission Partnership Committee. Welcome to Allison and thanks for her hard work with the Resurrection Clothes Closet along with Sandra Lewis. The Clothes Closet supports our adopted schools, Mays Elementary and Rice Elementary.



-- The Mardi Gras Fund Raiser netted \$11,215 for Mission activities this year. Thanks to the cooks, decorators, auction volunteers, second line volunteers, etc... for providing a festive pre-Lenten celebration.

-- The Greenwood Soup Kitchen recently received an Angel Award from the SC Secretary of State. This award recognizes 10 charities annually for outstanding performance. The Greenwood Soup Kitchen returns 99% of its program specific money to the community annually. They function with a 100% volunteer staff. Kudos to Norm and Roxie Fawcett for their leadership and commitment to the Soup Kitchen. The Soup Kitchen served 28,400 meals last year, which is back to normal after a pandemic surge to around 40,000 meals.

-- The Westside Coalition Planning Team is resuming its quarterly neighborhood meeting at Macedonia Church on Thursday, May 19 at 5:30. We'd love for anyone interested to join us there. For many years, Resurrection has supported the Westside renewal effort alongside Habitat for Humanity, the City of Greenwood, local churches, and others. Formation Moment: What do Pentecost and the Tower of Babel have in common?

The answer to the question presented in this article's title may be obvious if you are familiar with the Babel story. But that's not a story many

know well, so let me start with the short answer: tongues. In the Babel story, the gift of tongues seems like a curse; in the Pentecost story, the gift of tongues is a blessing. These two stories, one a Hebrew legend, the other a somewhat mystical birthday party, are connected in a meaningful way, and their comparison demonstrates the deep significance of our upcoming celebration of Pentecost Day.

The story of the Tower of Babel takes up nine verses in chapter 11 of Genesis. It is an odd story that falls just after a Christian favorite – Noah and the Flood. At the end of the Flood story, God commands Noah and his sons to “fill the earth.” Then Genesis continues with a chapter devoted to Noah’s descendants and the territories they filled. These descendants, or perhaps those led by Nimrod (great-great-grandson of Noah), still spoke only one language and settled in the land of Shinar.¹ These people decided to build a tower all the way to the heavens to “make a name for [them]selves” and avoid being “scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.” Their pride and fear led them to defy God’s command to “fill the earth.” God then decides to have a look at this tower and is not pleased – “... this is only the beginning of what they will do; nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them.” So God confuses the mortals’ language and “scatters them abroad,” the very result they had sought to avoid.

Following the Babel story, which again is sandwiched in passages about Noah’s descendants, comes the beginning of Hebrew history – God’s calling of Abram and Abram’s obedience to God’s command. So the biblical narrative continues through Hebrew scripture, prophecies and writings, the Psalms and Proverbs, all the way to the gospel stories of Jesus’ life, death and resurrection. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be given a gift and should wait in the city until they receive it. On the fiftieth day, while they were “all together in one place,” that gift arrived. With a sound

¹ An interesting side note: According to the bible, Nimrod was a mighty warrior or hunter. His first “kingdom was Babel... in the land of Shinar.” Shinar later was home to

“like the rush of a violent wind” came the Holy Spirit symbolized by divided tongues “as of fire” that enabled the disciples to speak in other languages. The disciples were thus fully equipped to share Jesus’ teachings throughout the whole world. And they did share those teachings. And the world was never the same.


So it seems that Pentecost is almost a parallel to the Babel story. Babel is an etiological tale of the diversity of human language but with a message: God does not desire uniformity but rather diversity. God does not desire his people to hunker down in fear but rather to bravely fill the earth as his co-creators. Pentecost is the etiological story of the Christian church with a similar, powerful message: God desires unity of purpose, but not uniformity. God empowers us by our diversity to accomplish God’s dream for creation. The Babel people clung to their uniformity as a mechanism of self-aggrandizement and preservation. Pentecost people fearlessly claim their diversity and use it to fill the earth with knowledge of God’s mercy and love. Let us all be Pentecost people. Collective action for selfish gain does not connect us to heaven; it brings shame upon us. But when God’s people work together for God’s purposes, with God’s help, we can change the world for the good of all. That is a truth worth celebrating!
