Our Mission

We are a people rooted in worship, branching out into the world.

Dear Church of the Resurrection Family,

As promised, I am updating you all on our Vestry Retreat that was held on January 20th. There was energy, compassion, excitement and most importantly a love for the Lord!



Charlie Long was elected Junior Warden! Charlie has all the necessary skills to do an excellent job as our Junior Warden.

Our first discussion, a review of our 2024 budget, was led by Archie Booker. The discussion focused on how we would resolve the final mortgage payments. Craig Church led a discussion of the history of our capital campaigns and presented an option for the remaining payments. After two mortgage payments in 2024, January and February, our debt will be \$35,500. To pay that debt, the vestry approved taking \$16,000 from the Make My Joy Complete account (pledge payments received and a small portion of our surplus from 2023 - this will clear this account), \$4,500 from special gifts (a gift we received from a donor in the community that left it to my discretionary how to use the gift) and requested \$15,000 from the Resurrection Foundation. This request will be made on January 25th. These amounts collectively provide the \$35,500 needed to completely eliminate the parish debt! This is amazing! We are retiring our debt one year early, freeing our budget of \$30,000 a year in mortgage payments and glorifying God in the process! I am so thankful to so many of you that made this possible. The vestry decided that we would have a celebration of this momentous occasion at our Pentecost Picnic on May 19th.

The vestry also decided to prioritize three areas of importance during the 2024 year: building maintenance, our stewardship campaign and fellowship events. We will also work on our bylaws and safety concerns. Of course, there will be other areas to focus on, but these are our priorities.

Fortunately, we had a surplus in 2022 and 2023, so we can begin to address delayed building maintenance using those funds. The priorities are replacing 7 toilets; replacing all the lights in the nave (Please note, we will use LED light bulbs, we are not replacing the fixtures; this is a very expensive project.); and scraping and painting the nave, the hallway that enters the nave, the sacristy, and the bathroom next to the sacristy. If you remember, we have already scraped and painted the narthex and the acolyte room. There are some other small projects that we will work on as well.

Our new columbarium addition is here! The vestry voted to increase the price for the columbarium niche from \$1,364 to \$1,529. In next month's Rafters, we will include more information about the columbarium.

On the subject of stewardship, we will have small gatherings so that you as parishioners can fully understand your gifts, the actual campaign, and the stewardship dinner.

Fellowship event planning will include, but not be limited to, the Oyster Roast and Chili Cook-off (coming up February 10th), Lenten suppers, Easter, the Bishop's visit and Graduating Seniors recognition, the Pentecost picnic and celebrating being debt free, celebrating 20 years of our amazing Denise Brown, and much more!

Finally, we are working hard to reestablish our committees! Vestry members will serve as

liaisons, but we need chairs and committee members. The vestry will work to identify committee members, but please reach out to me if you feel called to serve!



Anti-Racism Library Book of the Month:



"In this compelling and provocative book, acclaimed religious scholar Albert Raboteau tells the remarkable stories of Abraham Joshua Heschel, A. J. Muste, Dorothy Day, Howard Thurman, Thomas Merton, Martin Luther King, Jr., and Fannie Lou Hamer—inspired individuals who succeeded in conveying

their vision to the broader public through writing, speaking, demonstrating, and organizing. Raboteau traces how their paths crossed and their lives intertwined, creating a network of

committed activists who significantly changed the attitudes of several generations of Americans about contentious political issues such as war, racism, and poverty. Raboteau examines the influences that shaped their ideas and the surprising connections that linked them together. He discusses their theological and ethical positions, and describes the rhetorical and strategic methods these exemplars of modern prophecy used to persuade their fellow citizens to share their commitment to social change." – Princeton University Press

Resurrection Grief Group

Many of you may not know that there has been a Grief Group at Resurrection since January 2023. The six months before this time were filled with numerous losses for our church family members and their friends. Take a moment to think about those who are missing from our Sunday Worship, Wednesday Night Suppers, or Prime Timers. Many of their family members have been experiencing empty spaces in their hearts and lives. They have lost a part of themselves through the death of a parent, a beloved spouse, a precious child, a family pet, a divorce, a debilitating long-term disease, or another form of separation or heartache.

Fortunately for our church, Mary Balfour sought a way to help in the healing process for the grief-stricken in our midst. Each funeral service where Mary Balfour officiated also took its toll on her. She was feeling the pain of loss with each of us involved. Thankfully she found the *Grief Share Program* which consisted of thirteen sessions with videos highlighting people who have walked the journey of grief and loss. A group of parishioners and other friends who had experienced a loss met each Sunday afternoon for about two months in Emmaus Hall to begin the process.

Workbooks and weekly readings provided

opportunities for reflection. Our time together each week also included sharing our innermost feelings in a highly confidential and safe environment. As we became more confident within the group, everyone seemed to embrace this community of souls bearing our tears, laughter, and personal stories.

Many of us, myself included, did not want to end the program. The connections and comradery were strong among us. The personal moments we had shared through our grief would touch us all. Mary Balfour also felt the need to continue our time together with monthly sessions that included new people who wanted to explore more about how to help each other.

This group continues to come together monthly to share our unique journeys of living with loss. It is open to all, and it is fine to miss when there is a scheduling conflict. I have been blessed by this group as we share treasured memories, the depth of our love for a special person, and ways of coping with changes in our lives that occur after loss.

As Thorton Wilder wrote, "The greatest tribute to the dead is not grief but gratitude." Through this group of friends, I have been able to lessen my grief and increase my gratitude for the cherished life of my loved one.

Recently our Mission Partnerships Committee met to decide how to allocate all the financial donations that this congregation made over the course of 2023. We are all so fortunate, and sharing good fortune with others is the calling of every child of God. This year, the children of God in this parish shared \$27,174.31! Here is the breakdown of our giving:

These donations, however, are just a portion of the generosity you have shown in 2023. Each second Sunday of the year, we've collected in kind donations for many of the organizations listed above. We also gave \$868.21 to Crossroads Pregnancy Center through their Baby Bottle Campaign and our VBS program participants, along with this parish, gave \$1463.48 to Living Waters for the World. Then consider the Giving Tree Christmas presents you gave to the foster children served by Greenwood DSS and the food shared through our Blessing Box!

We are not meant to take pride in our generosity (though I am quite proud of you all), but to pass on the glory to God. For in reality, all that we have began with the creative power and grace of God. I'm reminded of a hymn we sometimes sing during our stewardship campaigns:

All things are thine; no gift have we, Lord of all gifts, to offer thee; And hence with grateful hearts today Thine own before thy feet we lay.

I hope and pray we'll be able to maintain this generous spirit through 2024. There are many opportunities to give even now. Read on for more information!

Our monthly service of Holy Eucharist and Healing will be held on Wednesday, February 7, at 12 noon.




Our monthly service of Holy Eucharist at Wesley Commons will be held on Tuesday, February 13, at 11:00 am.
