

intimidated by this, think of it as a time spent with God and being in relationship with others.



The Youngest Marcher tells the true story of Audrey Faye Hicks who was one of the youngest participants in the Children's Crusade in Birmingham in May 1963. The book recounts

her experience, from the perspective of the 9year-old girl that she was during the Crusade, and ends with her joy at seeing segregation come to an end as the result of her brave effort.

served Church of the Resurrection as an acolyte and a VBS volunteer.


Lila Malone Eisenreich

Rogation is coming to a garden near you!

Are you wondering just what "Rogation" is? The etymology of the word reveals much. Rogation is derived from the Latin root, rogare, which means "ask for". In our religious context, rogation means to ask for God's blessing, particularly upon the gardens and grounds of a parish.

Rogation has an ancient history, dating back to the year 598 or perhaps even earlier. The Catholic church initiated the tradition likely to supplant a pagan ritual of processing from Rome to a place outside the city where animals would be sacrificed in exchange for the gods' protection of their gardens from blight. The Roman Catholic procession omitted the animal sacrifice and instead processed to St. Peter's Basilica for the

celebration of mass. The tradition evolved into a procession around the boundaries of a parish during which congregants occasionally stopped and marked the grounds with a cross, prayer or bible reading. They checked on the farms in the area and prayed for a healthy harvest.

Rogation observance began long before industrialization when humanity was utterly dependent upon agricultural success year to year; hence, the need for God's mercy and protection from crop failure. In our modern, industrialized culture, agricultural success is nonetheless essential to life. We still need food to eat. But we don't witness the work and risks of agriculture in such a direct way. It is easy to rest in the convenience of our neighborhood Publix which never fails to provide. But we should not forget entirely the necessity of a full harvest, and Rogationtide offers us suburbanites an opportunity to be grateful for farms and farmers, for agriculture and for the conservation of the natural world.

In modern rogation processions, the celebrant asks God to bless a garden, field or farm at planting time that it might yield a full harvest. These processions take place on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the sixth week of Easter, ending just before Ascension Day. The Sixth Sunday of Easter has been added as Rogation Sunday and celebrated with a special collect and proper applying the theme of fruitful harvest and stewardship of creation (see BCP 207-208, 258-259). This year those dates are May 5 through 8.

Perhaps you have a garden, or even a small farm, for which you would like to seek God's mercy and blessing? Here is a prayer you may use at home. It comes from a blessing liturgy that was written for rogation day celebrations in the Episcopal Church:

Holy One: Bless and protect this garden and all who keep it. Strengthen and uphold them in their labor, that these plants may bear good fruit and our care for the earth may witness to your love and justice; in the name of the Creator, Word, and Spirit. Amen.






Our monthly service of Holy Eucharist at Wesley Commons will be held on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 14</u>, at 11:00 am.
