Dear Church of the Resurrection Family,

I have watched you comfort those who mourn, celebrate with those who rejoice, and offer strength to those who struggle. Your encouragement has reminded me daily why I was called to ministry. In your faces, I have seen Christ's love reflected back to me. In your words, I have heard God's affirmation of the work we have done together. You have been God's instruments of grace in my life, and for that, I am eternally grateful.

As I prepare to leave, I want you to know how confident I am in your future. The foundation of faith you have built here is strong and sure. The love you show one another and your community is a powerful witness to God's kingdom. Continue to be the light of Jesus in this community. Keep praying for one another, keep serving those in need, keep worshiping with joy and reverence. The work we have begun together will continue to flourish under God's faithful guidance and your committed hearts.

Thank you for letting me love you, thank you for loving me. Remember that I love you but most importantly God loves you.

From your Senior Warden:

It has been an eventful month for the vestry and for our whole COR family as we prepare to say goodbye to Mary Balfour and give her our blessings as she begins a new ministry at the Church of the Epiphany. At the same time, we are beginning to imagine and pray about the next chapter God is preparing for us.

Over the past few weeks, many of you have approached me and other vestry members offering help, asking how you can support the church, and expressing your deep love for this parish. Your willingness to step forward has been a bright spot in this season. It shows just how strong and committed this community is.

Of course, times of transition can also bring questions: What happens next? How long will this take? What do we do in the meantime? These are natural concerns, and many of us, myself included, are asking them.

One thing that has brought me a lot of comfort is knowing that the diocese has a clear and well-tested process for clergy transitions, and they will walk alongside us every step of the way. Janey Wilson, the Clergy Transition Coordinator, has been fantastic. She told me the first time I talked to her that I could call her anytime and I think she might already be regretting that because I sure have taken her up on it.

She met with the vestry on November 3 and gave us some guidance on timelines and next steps and she gave us a little homework to do as we get ready for this transition. We have invited her to offer the same presentation to the parish on **Sunday, January 25**, when she will also serve as our supply priest. I hope you will make plans to be there and ask questions.

We have also secured clergy coverage for Sundays in the first quarter of the new year. Woo Hoo! Between Mike Flannagan, Chris Craig-Jones, and our own Mitchell Felton, we are grateful to have worship leadership in place. Obviously, this is not a long-term plan, but it gives us a solid foundation as we move into the next stage of discernment.

The vestry will continue to update the parish each month in the Rafters, because we know communication is essential in times like these. Please feel free to ask us questions and we will answer them as best we can.

As we enter the season of Advent, I've been struck by the irony, and maybe the grace, of going through this transition right now. Advent is all about waiting, not passively but with purpose; about preparing our hearts for what we cannot see or understand; and about trusting that God is already at work in the unfolding of things. I think this transition is asking this of us: to pause, to reflect, to stay grounded in the present moment even as we anticipate what comes next. Part of that present moment is the time we still have with Mary Balfour. Over these six years, she has blessed this parish with energy, compassion, love, grit, and deep pastoral care. In the coming weeks, I hope we can celebrate her ministry with joy, gratitude, and love.

Transitions are never easy, but they often reveal who we truly are. And what I have seen in recent weeks is your generosity, your steadiness, and your love for each other. It encourages me that COR is strong, faithful, and ready for the road ahead.

We will walk it together, one step at a time and I know that God will lead us.


